Current situation in New Orleans...

- No official state commission yet in Louisiana
- Ad hoc local committee has begun planning and advocacy for Louisiana's War of 1812 anniversary
- Members of this committee also participating in teleconferences of the War of 1812 Historical Sites Committee

- Using personal and professional contacts to build support

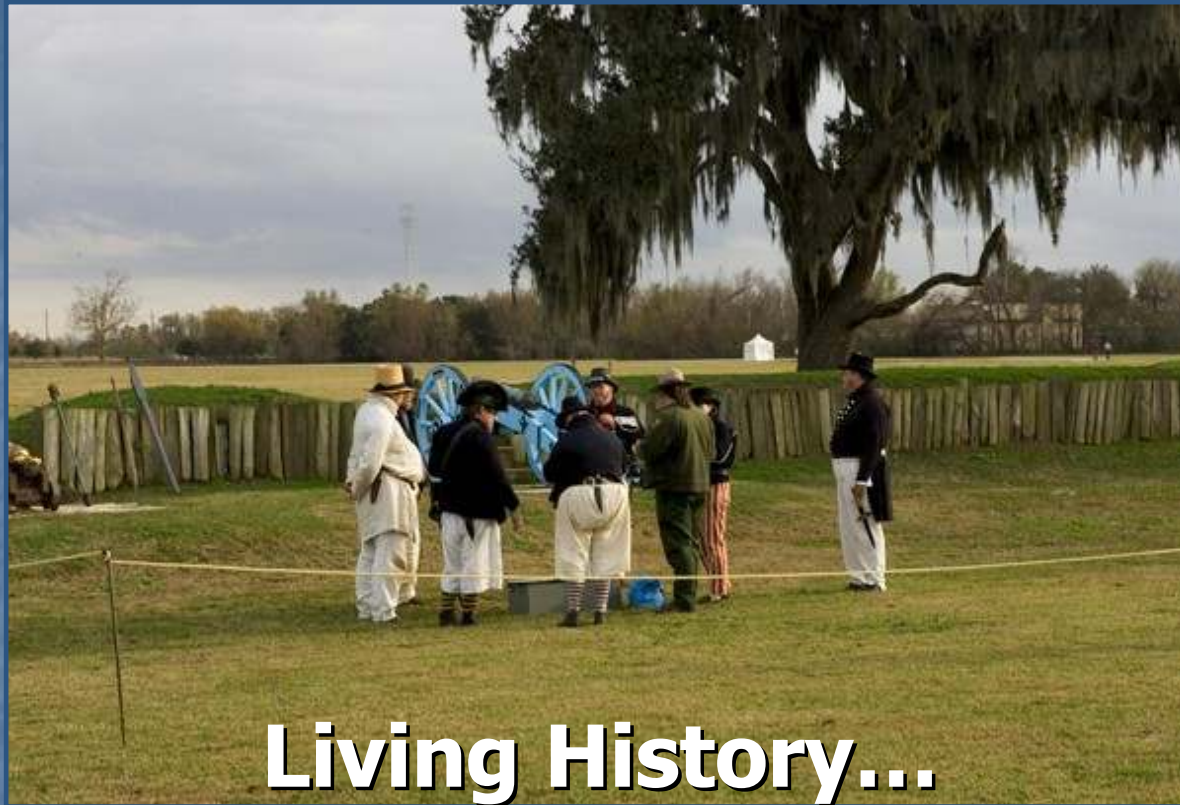

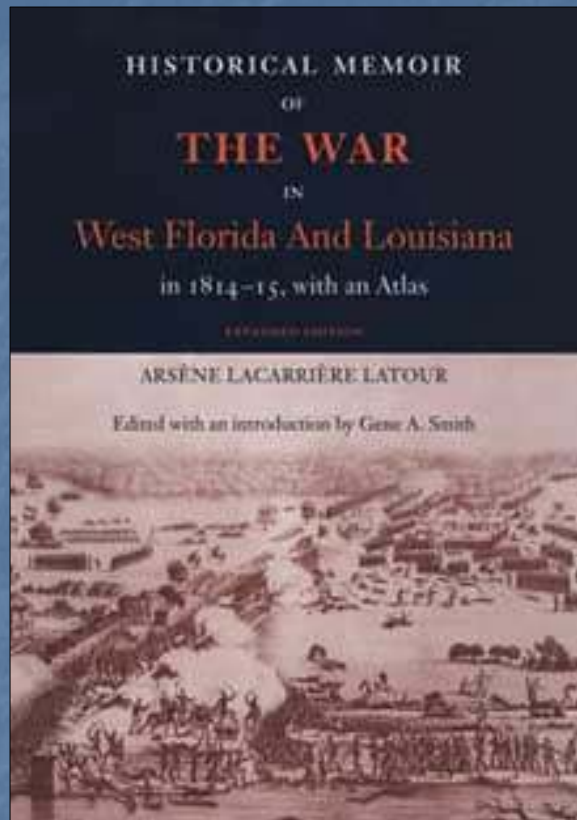

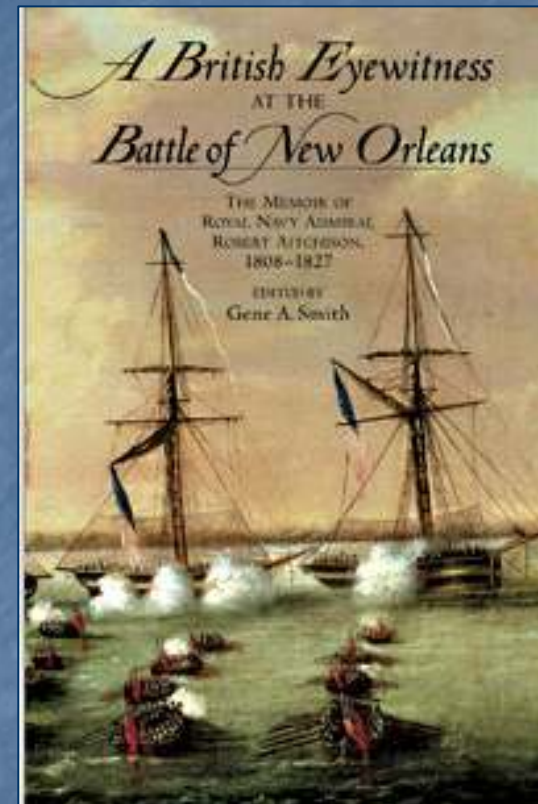
